Film Screening: Woman in Motion

In 1977, NASA struggled to recruit scientists, engineers, and astronauts for their new Space Shuttle Program. That's when Nichelle Nichols, Star Trek's Lt. Uhura, challenged NASA by asking the question: "Where are my people?" Nichols then embarked on a four-month campaign to recruit the first Black, Latino, and Asian men and women to fly in space. En 1977, la NASA luchaba por reclutar científicos, ingenieros y astronautas para su nuevo programa de transbordadores espaciales. Fue entonces cuando Nichelle Nichols, la teniente Uhura de Star Trek, desafió a la NASA formulando la pregunta: "¿Dónde está mi gente?" Nichols se embarcó entonces en una campaña de cuatro meses para reclutar a los primeros hombres y mujeres negros, latinos y asiáticos que volarían al espacio. [96 min; documental; inglés].

It is a n homage to the beauty, intensity and variety of Mexico's musical
